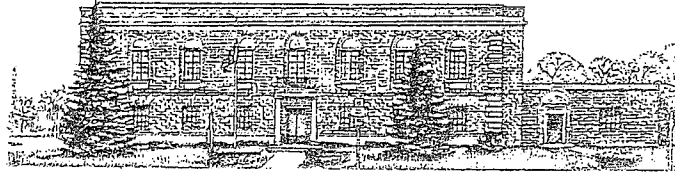

## FALCONER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD REPORT APRIL 11, 2022 – MAY 9, 2022

The artwork from Alieda Foulk's senior art class from Falconer Central School was on display through the month of April. This display was well received and plans are being made to make this an annual event.

The artwork from Laura Obrist's 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes at Fenner Elementary are on display for the month of May. There will be an open house held on Tuesday, May 17<sup>th</sup> from 4-6.

The library celebrated the Month of the Young Child in April. On Wednesday, April 27<sup>th</sup>, Ashley Nelson, Story Hour Director shared information with the parents and provided the children in her Story Hour classes with coloring sheets. We also received the book We're Better Together – A Book about Community by Eileen Spinelli from the Chautauqua Child Care Council at Chautauqua Opportunities.

Senior Library Clerk, Sandy Thies attended the Summer Reading workshop provided by the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System on Wednesday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at the Prendergast Library. She came back with fun ideas as well as winning some activities to add to our Makerspace Area.

Mrs. Nelson celebrated the last Story Hour classes on Wednesday, May 4, 2022. The theme was firefly day. Each child was presented with a certificate of completion and a copy of the book The Very Lonely Firefly by Eric Carle. She also provided them with information about our upcoming Summer Reading Program.

Our Saturday staff, Ashley Nelson and Carrie Lyon, are beginning a new program called "Story Play Saturday" on May 14<sup>th</sup>. They will provide stations and books that are based on a monthly theme. There will be dramatic play, lego activities, arts and crafts, science experiments and more.

The library received a grant made possible by the Falconer Region Community Fund at the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation. The grant will cover licensing for two movie events for the village to be held at the Falconer Central School football field. The first movie will be on Friday, July 22, 2022 with a Christmas themed movie to go with the village Christmas in July celebration.
