FALCONER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD REPORT

MAY 9, 2022 – JUNE 13, 2022

The artwork from Laura Obrist's 3rd, 4th and 5th grade classes at Fenner Elementary were on display for the month of May. We held an open house on Tuesday, May 17th from 4-6. This event was very well attended!

Megan Disbro, Digital Services Librarian with the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System, provided a LIBBY training session at the library on May 10th from 1:30 – 2:30. This presentation was very informational and 15 patrons participated.

The Falconer Public Library Board met on Thursday May 26th. The Board approved changing our book ordering from Brodart to Amazon on a trial basis to see if we can make new material available for our patrons a little faster.

The library received a grant made possible by the Reg and Betty Lenna Fund at the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation. The grant will allow us to purchase, Juvenile books, Playaways, STEM activities, board games and oversize games. We will be sharing many of the games with the Village of Falconer Summer Recreation Program and with the Community during the Christmas in July Festival.

We had a student intern from Falconer Central School/ BOCES join us for the month of May. Justin Johnston provided computer assistance to our staff and patrons during his time with us.

Sixth Grade classes from Falconer Central School visited the library June 7th, 9th and 16th during their "Our Place" program. The students are learning about the history of Falconer. We provided history of the library, information about summer events and our Summer Reading Program and allowed them to complete a scavenger hunt in the library.

We are encouraging patrons to participate in the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System Road Trip. It is a fun way to get out and explore all 38 libraries in the Library System.
