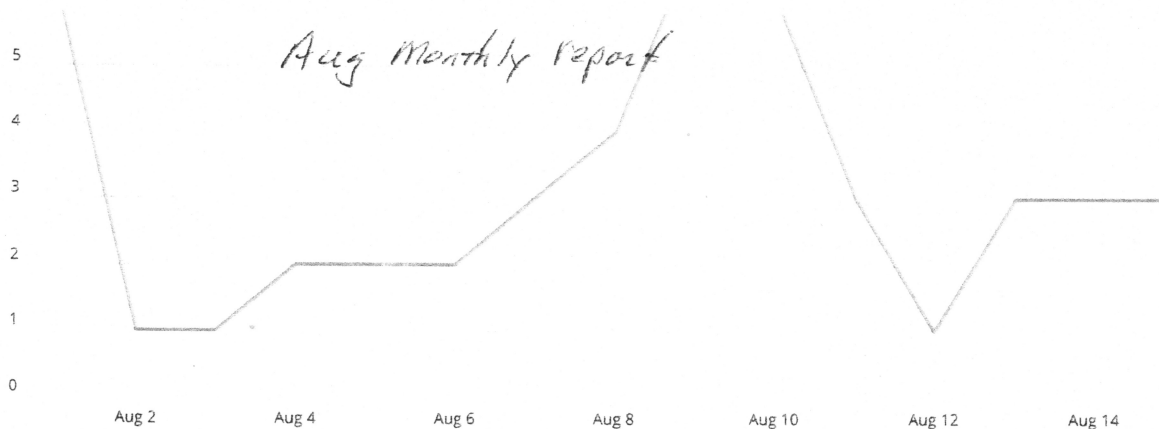

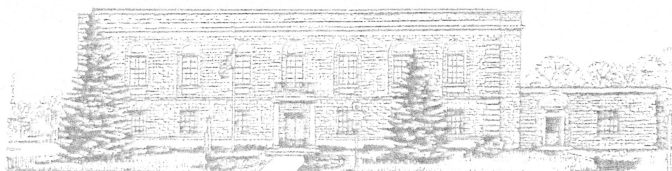

FALCONER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD REPORT AUGUST 8, 2022 – SEPTEMBER 19, 2022

During the month of August, we provided an “August Activity Challenge” for patrons of all ages. They were given a list of 30 activities and were asked to complete 20 of them to be entered into a drawing to win a tub of pretzel nuggets and bag of Hershey’s chocolate nuggets.

The Glenn Colton concert on Thursday, August 11th at Davis Park, sponsored by a grant from the United Arts Appeal was a huge success. Our oversized outside games were available before the concert. We had 97 people attend! We had another game/movie night on Friday, August 12, 2022 at Falconer Central School. We showed the movie Luca to go with our Summer Reading theme. These events were made possible through a grant from the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation Reg and Betty Lenna Fund. Unfortunately, we only had 20 people attend this event.

Laurie Becker and Sandy Thies set up a table at the Falconer Central School Back to School Bash on September 1st. We shared information about the library as well as signing teens up to volunteer at the library.

We have an art display by Cindy Humble in the library for the month of September. She is sharing beautiful watercolor and acrylic paintings with us. She also has a touching story about losing her daughter to cancer last year. Eric Tichy of the Jamestown Post Journal shared her story on the front page of the newspaper Thursday, September 8th. We held a “Meet the Artist” open house on Saturday, September 10th with 30 attending.

On September 14th our three and four year old Story Hour classes began. Story Hour Director, Ashley Nelson has 13 children registered for these Wednesday morning classes and is off to a great start!

Our application for a state construction grant with the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System has been submitted. This grant, if approved, will help with the cost of replacing the library’s handicapped accessible door and renovations to this area.
