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Looking into Chautauqua Community foundation to apply for grant for thermal imaging cameras for air packs. Total 4 to 6 depending on grant availability. These cameras will assist in searching for victims and fire sources in buildings. Also they are trackable as so you can see where the crews are in a house or building and in the event of a "man down" you will be able to pin point there location for quicker rescue.

Applying for the grant helps the fire department acquire needed tools to assure that the firefighters are well protected and have the equipment they need to perform their duties safely and assure their safety. Most if not all items received through grant money could not be acquired through the village or the association due to budgets and lack of funding through the village and town. For the minimal fee we pay to have these grants processed, the reward is well worth it. I will continue to search for and apply for grants when they are available to assure that the firefighters have what they need to preform their duties safely and efficiently.

It is a dell OptiPlex unit. The unit is big enough and able to upgrade in the future.



Book Club will meet on Tuesday, March 19th at 1:30. Those attending are reading a book from our "Blind Date with a Book" cart.


Craft Club met on March 5th. The group made book markers to share with our patrons. We are very appreciative of this group and their support of our library.

In 2019 and 2020, with the assistance of Ingall's Planning & Design, the Village of Falconer adopted a new Comprehensive in addition to a new Zoning Law and Zoning Map. While extensive work went into the creation of these new planning and zoning documents, it has become evident that some specific parcels may need to be changed to more accurately reflect the zoning district that better suits the current use of these parcels.

This matter has been brought to the attention of the Village Trustees and they have referred this matter to the Planning Board for their review and recommendation as to whether any changes are warranted and would be in compliance with the provisions of the Comprehensive Plan.

I, Andrew Meyers, the sole proprietor of Hallux Disc Golf LLC and resident of Falconer, NY, would like approval from the Village of Falconer to host a disc golf tournament at the newly established Falconer Park Disc Golf Course on May 18, 2024.

A disc golf tournament is an engaging community event for all ages and walks of life. Many players who compete travel up to several hours to play, yet there is also a large local group of disc golfers who would participate. Hosting such an event annually will bring greater awareness to Falconer Park in the disc golf community and to the area as a whole.

This event will be the first annual "Hallux Disc Golf Huckaway" and will feature two rounds of disc golf with an estimated amount of 40-75 players in attendance ranging in skill level from novice to pro. An entry fee of \$30-\$40 would cover a player's pack, modest cash payouts as well as any additional costs (water/snacks for players, etc.). Hallux Disc Golf will be present to vend with an on-site pro shop consisting of discs and other disc golf sporting goods.

Holes will need to be clear of pedestrian traffic and recreation. I will provide signage within the park and around the perimeter informing the public of the ongoing event. The main parking lot would ideally be used for parking, and a pavilion to function as the tournament central.
