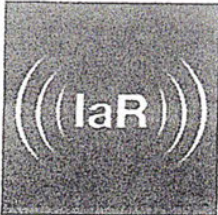

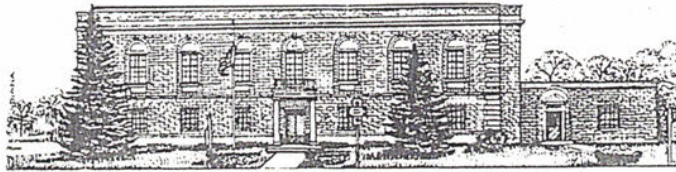

## FALCONER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD REPORT MAY 12, 2025 – JUNE 9, 2025

Our last Story Hour session for this year was held on Wednesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>. Story Hour Director, Ashley Nelson provided the children with wonderful themes and activities throughout the thirty session program. We already have children signed up for when we begin again in September.

The Book Club met on May 20<sup>th</sup>. They discussed books that had been made into a movie. They will meet again on June 17<sup>th</sup>. Readers are asked to read a science fiction or historical book for the next discussion.

Our knitting group will meet on June 12<sup>th</sup> and June 26<sup>th</sup>. Craft club will meet on June 16<sup>th</sup>. The group will be helping us prepare for our Summer Reading Program activities.

# Native Plantings

## *Falconer Park and Village rights-of-way*

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There are many opportunities for the Village to plant native tree and shrub species on its lands. Here I show a single location in Falconer Park and within the rights-of-way, but such plantings could be done anywhere on Village property where there is only grass planted. The benefits to the Village are numerous:

- Increased beauty – tree stumps and grass fields can be replaced by vibrant trees and shrubs.
- Decreased maintenance – native planting areas no longer have to be mowed, which will save the Village money on labor, gas, and equipment maintenance.
- Decreased pollution – less mowing means less noise and air pollution generated from equipment.
- Improved habitat – native species provide habitat for native insects – especially pollinator species whose populations are shown to be decreasing drastically.
- Resilience against erosion – the roots of native plants will secure the soil from erosion more effectively than regular grass.
- Resilience against invasive species – establishing native plantings now will make it more difficult for invasive species to establish themselves in the future.

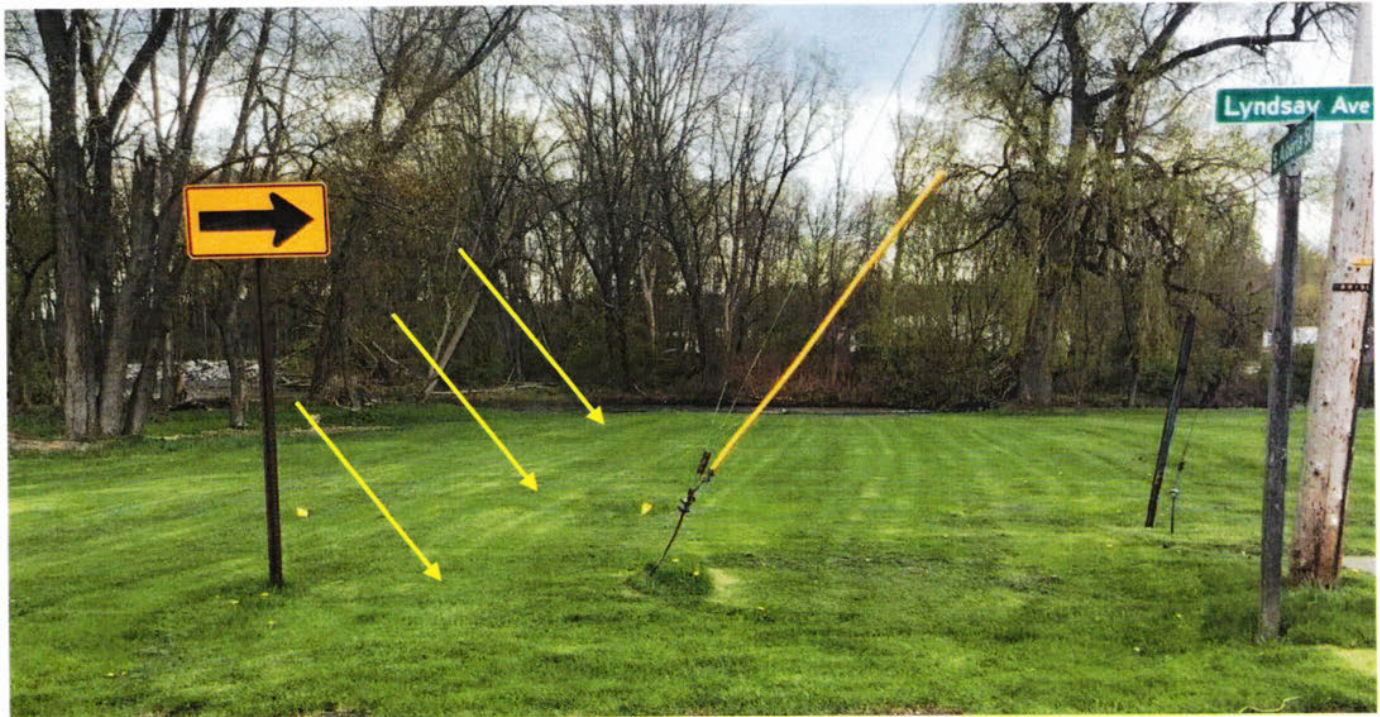

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#### 2. Rights-of-way

There are several rights-of-way in the Village, such as Alberta St. and Wilson St., which have nothing planted besides grass. Installing native trees and shrubs in areas such as these would be inexpensive and would bring many benefits to the Village.

## **Invasive Species Removal**

There are many areas throughout the Village where Japanese knotweed is growing. This is an invasive species that grows very fast and densely and crowds out native plant species. Removing this plant throughout the Village will enhance the beauty of the community and provide a better habitat for valuable native plant species. The main areas identified include Falconer Park, Millrace Park, and adjacent to Coleson Park.

### **1. Falconer Park**

There are multiple areas of knotweed growth, such as along the southern side of Moon Brook.

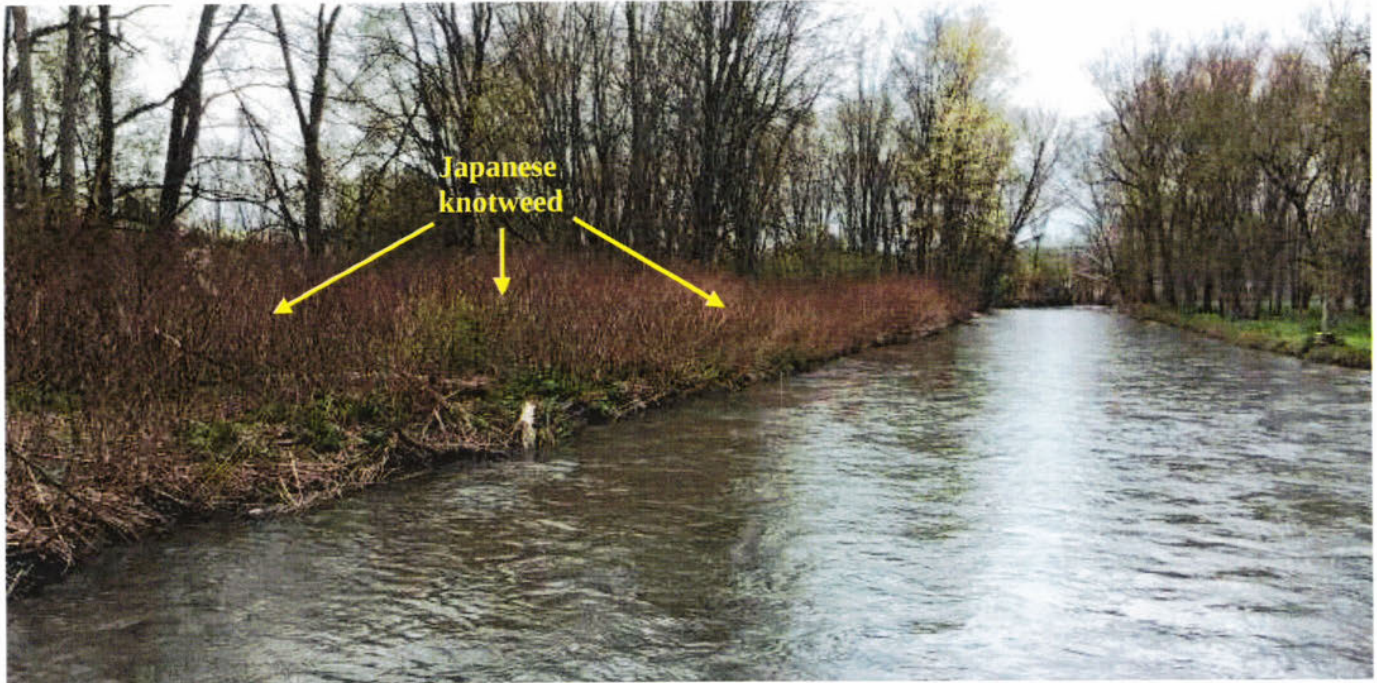

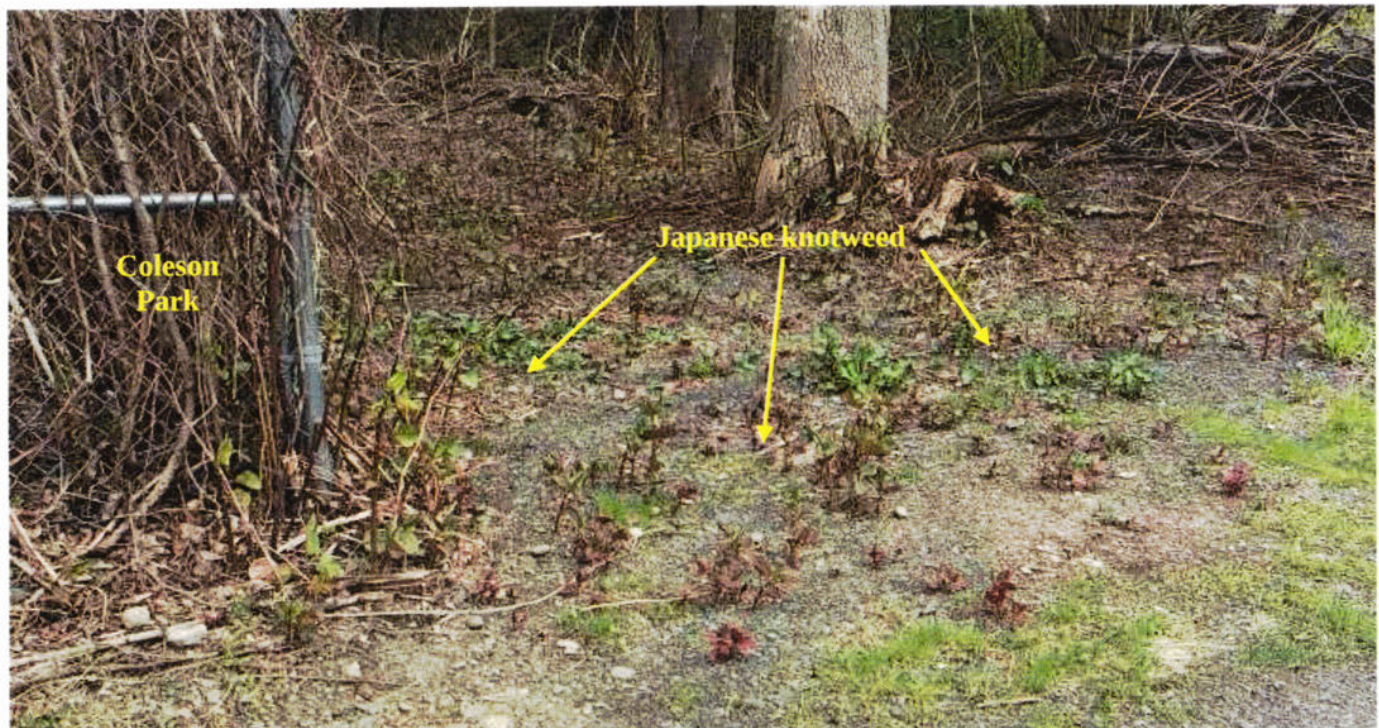

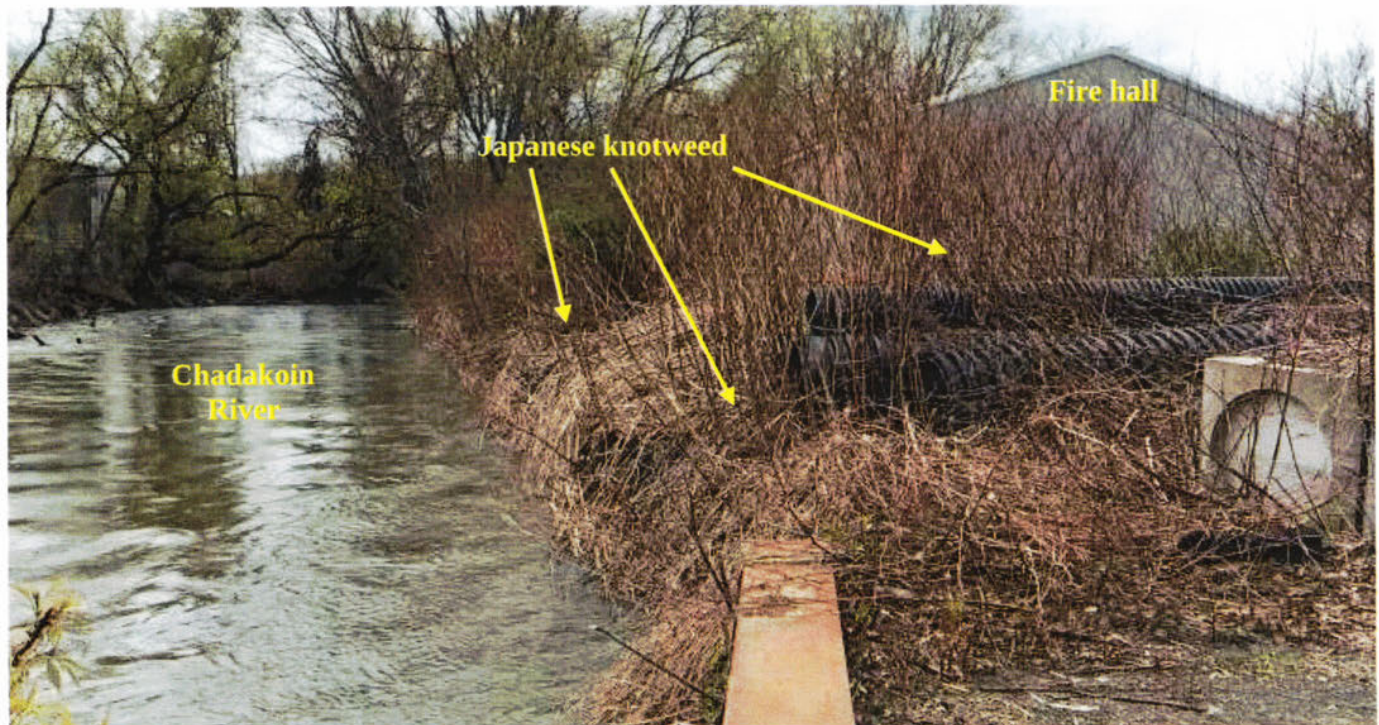

# Streambank Remediations

*Falconer Park and adjacent to Coleson Park*

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## 1. Falconer Park

There is significant erosion occurring along the bank of Moon Brook at the western edge of the footpath in Falconer Park. As long as this issue is unaddressed, the Village is continuously losing land to erosion.

- Moon Brook is a NYSDEC “Class B Stream”, meaning a permit is required for any work in the stream.

# Streambank Remediations

*Falconer Park and adjacent to Coleson Park*

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## 2. Adjacent to Coleson Park

Between Coleson Park and the Village meeting hall there is a section of sheet pile wall along the riverbank. Replacing the sheet pile wall with a natural hardscaped streambank would provide many permanent benefits to the Village, such as:

- Improving the recreational potential of the area – citizens can enjoy nearby Coleson Park and access the Chadakoin River where there was no access previously.
- Improved safety – a gently-sloped streambank will provide safe river access, whereas the sheet pile wall poses a safety hazard.
- Ecological benefits – sheet pile walls do not provide any benefit to wildlife, as there is no potential for entry and exit into the river. A sloped natural bank will improve wildlife habitat. Native species planted for stabilization will provide further benefit.
- Beautification – this is a highly visible area, central to the Village and directly adjacent to the meeting hall. A more beautiful, ecologically-friendly streambank will enhance the value of the area and the overall attractiveness of the community.
